This week the children have been learning about three digraphs that make the same sound. The children call the 'e-e' digraph a 'split digraph' –

ee (busy busy bee ee ee ee)

ea (beans in your dreams ea ea ea)

e-e (perfect Pete e-e e-e e-e)

tree	peas	sweet
dream	athlete	these
jeans	sheep	leaf
teeth	seal	concrete

In Year 1 the children are beginning to learn how to join their letters. When writing, please encourage your child to join the digraphs together, and to put the 'lead ins' and 'leads outs' on all other letters (see table above on how to write the words).

Can you sort the above words into three groups?

Please practise reading these words.

Encourage your child to say and blend the phonemes together first and then say the word, eg t-r-ee (tree) l-ea-f (leaf) a-th-l-e-t(e) (athlete)

Can you find any more words to add to the groups?

Challenge: Have a go at writing some sentences with ee/ea/e-e words in them.

Please continue to hear your child read daily – little and often is best. Reading doesn't have to be their reading book every day; Vary it by reading some comics, follow a recipe, read books from home/the library, etc.
